Message from the Chair

nglish Online is grateful to work and support the needs of newcomers on Treaty One Territory, on the original lands of the Anishinaabeg, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota and Dene peoples, and on the homeland of the Métis Nation. Despite the challenges of the pandemic which saw fewer newcomers arrive in Manitoba, the organization provided language and settlement support to over 600 new and returning clients. As a provider of online services, English Online was of course perfectly positioned to address the needs of newcomers in a year that permitted only virtual interaction. Thanks to the excellent efforts of its staff and its Executive Director, the organization thrived when others struggled. Its LINC Home Study Program expanded to 75 seats.



Its overall client base increased by 150%. Funding arrangements by both federal and provincial funders were renewed; in fact, federal funding was renewed for 5 years, which will allow the organization to engage in long-term strategic planning and make important investments for the future. One such investment was approved earlier this year by the board: the creation of a new website and a new learning management system for English Online, which will support the growing needs of the organization into the future.

The Board wants to thank all those who are integral to the success of the organization:

- Its clients who provide the inspiration for the work of English Online.
- Its funding partners Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada and the Province of Manitoba – who provide financial support;
- Its dedicated staff who have not only supported their clients throughout this difficult year, but have collaborated on important new initiatives to make the organization even stronger;
- And its Executive Director who has led the organization through times of change and from which it has emerged with a clear vision for the future.

Thank you to the board members who served the organization in 2020/21, including the five new board members who joined the organization in the fall. A special thank you to those who are leaving the Board at the end of this year: Cathy Dowd, who also served as Secretary for many years, and Charlie Shymko."

Message from the Executive Director

would like to acknowledge that English Online is in Treaty 1 territory and that that the land on which English Online serves newcomers is the traditional territory of Anishinaabeg, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota, and Dene Peoples, and the homeland of the Métis Nation.

The year of 2020-2021 began with the first lockdown amid the COVID-19 pandemic. Yet, despite the pandemic challenges faced by many, English Online continued its services without interruptions. The two major reasons for the seamless service of English Online were transparency and collaboration, which were necessary in addressing the higher need for the remote newcomer support in times of the lockdown/pandemic.



To ensure that English Online team, although small, is operating at its most efficacy, we started to work in sub-teams that dealt with specific issues and requests from the learners. Such a collaboration called for more focused and more transparent work among the sub-teams. Not only did we see the improvement in communication especially of the time sensitive matters, but also we became even closer as a team than before the pandemic all while working remotely. I am greatly honored to work with such a magnificent team!

The ongoing support of the English Online Board provided another asset to ensure that the needs of English Online clients were met beyond and above. This year, the Board welcomed Jennifer Jochem, Karlene Debance, Marni Russell, Charlie Shymko, and Mohit Kumar Singh. Along with Stephanie Olson, Iwona Gniadek, and Cathy Dowd, the new Board members brought new perspectives, insights, and questions that played a vital role in the daily operations of English Online. I would like to thank each of you for your input and guidance during this unusual year!

The year of pandemic initiated two new invaluable partnerships. One was with Société de la francophonie manitobaine. Under this partnership, English Online was offering its LINC Home Study program (remote, formal, one-on-one English language training) to Permanent Resident francophones in selected rural areas in Manitoba. The other partnership was with the Department of Urban and Inner-City Studies at the University of Winnipeg. Through this partnership, English Online offered two work-placements to Indigenous students. These students provided additional support with the management, navigation, and optimization of the social media channels as well as developed and executed a series of webinars about the Traditions, Culture, and Life of Indigenous People in Canada for the learners.

English Online's success continued to depend on its learners – the newcomers to Manitoba. The following pages shed some light on the contribution of "flexible and accessible services that enable newcomers to succeed and reach their full potential" as well as the benefit of a "comprehensive online environment that brings resources, people and technology together to address newcomers' unique needs for settlement and integration into the workplace and community."

In conclusion, "Coming together is a beginning, staying together is progress, and working together is success" (Henry Ford): the success of the pandemic year was produced by working together with the Staff, Board, Funders, Partners, and Learners. I look forward to another year of "successful togetherness"!
