Land Acknowledgement

"My name is Mariela, I'm from Latin America, specifically from Venezuela; I'm here since August 2021. My experience in this course has been a wonderful journey, I'm only 7 months old and my learning has been fast. We have great teachers who make the class fun and dynamic like

Blaine, Pam and others, you can also have a personal instructor who calls you every week and assigns you homework, in my case I have Tanveen, she is wonderful with me and very helpful. Having online classes is better than I imagined." *Mariela*

"In Canada, I don't think people have a problem with my vocabulary and grammar but they don't understand me because of my accent. You probably understand me very well now because I have been working with Nastashya. I love that she meets with me every week and for 20 minutes we work on my pronunciation" *Dzung* "Back in Argentina I was most of the time studying grammar. I'm not saying that it's not useful, yes it's very useful but with Ruxandra, I started learning in a different way. She is my support, but it's up to me, my goals, and doing research. I like that part where I take responsibility about my improvement.

I don't have too much time to study. I need to find gaps (free time) for studying. I think that studying LINC is a good way to take advantage of those gaps being at home. So I 100% recommend it." *Sole*

"I practice my English during the week when I connect with English Online. Learning here is helpful because you also learn about Canada, about Winnipeg, Manitoba. In the class you learn about the clothes to wear in winter. You learn about places to buy things, the beautiful parks in Manitoba, winter activities ... many things that I didn't know about. I also know a lot of vocabulary now. If you knew me two years ago, you'll probably say, that's not the same woman!" *Silvia*

I like the kindness of the teachers and their ability to create a favourable atmosphere in order to learn and give the best of one's self. They're all very nice. They give you confidence to speak. Even if you make mistakes, you'll learn. They don't judge you. And if you ask them a question that they do not know the answer to, they will look for it and come back to you afterwards. It's a good attitude since nobody has all the answers."

"I am really grateful to EO and my LINC teachers. They are always the best; in time, with love and passion they teach us and help us with our questions. I love learning English with them. A few years ago I never imagined English would be a great way to meet amazing people. I feel more confident and happy with my English. I can't say enough thanks to my amazing teachers. Ruxandra, always encouraging me to continue learning, seeing the best in me, even when I don't see it. Pam is the sweetest teacher I have ever known, she is patient and so kind. She is always encouraging me to practice, I really appreciate her feedback because I learn from every mistake. With Blain I learn a lot about Canada's culture, history and politics. He always explains every detail, no matter how many times we ask the same question, he explains with patience and knowledge. Thanks for all the amazing work you do for us." Silvia

"When I attended my first class in the program, everybody spoke English and I thought, wow, this is going to be hard. At first I thought it would be explained in my own language and I discovered, no, it's not like that, it is English everything! But how the teacher handled the classroom matters.
